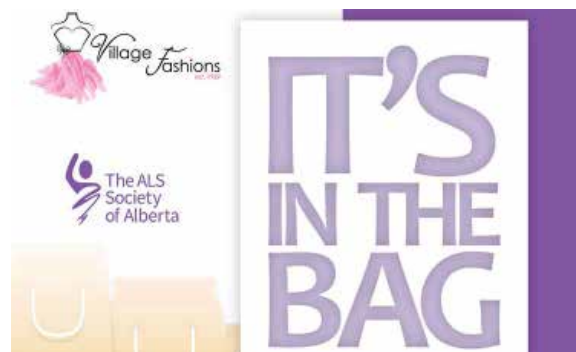
3rd Annual Bob Rock Memorial Golf Tournament

Research Update

EDMONTON

There are more investigational drug trials than ever before for the treatment of ALS. The ALS Clinic in Edmonton offers many avenues to participate in research. The clinic is actively recruiting for multiple clinical trials. Dr. Wendy Jonhston, Clinic Director, is directing two main areas of research, Communications and Information seeking in people affected by ALS and investigational drug trials.

CALSNIC

Currently there is no test for ALS. Whereas, many other disorders are diagnosed with a simple blood test, x-ray or CT, the diagnosis of ALS is made in large part by ruling out other diseases that can mimic it. It is not uncommon that a patient has waited over a year for the diagnosis to be secured. Without a test that can objectively measure how much a patient with ALS is affected also delays the testing and discovery of new drugs.

The Canadian ALS Neuroimaging Consortium (CALSNIC) was formed to create and evaluate new tests for ALS that use advanced MRI. CALSNIC has 7 participating sites in Canada, and has recently branched internationally to include 2 sites in the USA. Over 170 patients and 130 health subjects have been enrolled from ALS clinics thus far. There have been a number of publications and presentations arising from CALSNIC. Most recently, Dr. Kalra and his team updated the international community at the ALSMND Symposium in Glasgow last December, at the ALS Canada Research Forum in Toronto in April, and at the American Academy of Neurology in May.

The CALSNIC team thanks patients, their caregivers, and friends and family who have given so generously of their time to be participants in the study. The study continues for another 2 years.

CAPTURE ALS

The Comprehensive Analysis Platform To Understand, Remedy, and Eliminate (CAPTURE) ALS is an initiative by Canadian investigators that will extend CALSNIC to include collection of blood, CSF, and post-mortem tissue. Such a biobank would be a critical resource for researchers to understand basic mechanisms and develop new diagnostic tests towards improving our understanding of ALS and finding effective treatment

CALGARY

There are three current ALS studies happening now and recruiting for all three.

MALLINCKRODT ACTHAR PENNANT STUDY

A MULTICENTRE, DOUBLE BLIND, PLACEBO CONTROLLED STUDY TO ASSESS THE EFFICACY AND SAFETY OF H.P. ACTHAR GEL IN THE TREATMENT OF SUBJECTS WITH AMYOTROPHIC LATERAL SCLEROSIS

Acthar is a prescription drug approved in Canada by Health Canada for use in some diseases such as systemic lupus erythematosus (SLE). It has also been approved in the USA by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) called H.P. Acthar® Gel (Repository Corticotropin Injection, for the use in some diseased such as systemic lupus erythematosus (SLE). It has not been approved by regulatory authorities for ALS.

This study is being conducted to determine if Acthar will help patients with ALS by either slowing down how fast ALS symptom progress and/or increasing life expectancy.

PIMOZIDE 2 STUDY

A PHASE II RANDOMIZED, PLACEBO-CONTROLLED, DOUBLE-BLINDED, MULTI-CENTRE CLINICAL TRIAL OF PIMOZIDE IN PATIENTS WITH AMYOTROPHIC LATERAL SCLEROSIS

Pimozide is a neuroleptic medication that is approved by Health Canada and the FDA to treat chronic psychosis, Tourette Syndrome, and resistant tics. This study will look at whether Pimozide may help to slow the progression of ALS through this mechanism.

ORION “REFALS” LEVOSIMENDAN

EFFECTS OF ORAL LEVOSIMENDAN (ODM-109) ON RESPIRATORY FUNCTION IN PATIENTS WITH ALS

Levosimendan (Simadax®) is a FDA approved medication given through the vein for heart failure. It is not approved for use in Canada currently for either heart failure or ALS. In this study, the same substance will be tested for ALS given as a capsule taken via the mouth. Levosimendan (ODM-109) is an investigational medications, meaning that it has not been approved by regulatory authorities for ALS.

The main purpose of this research study is to measure how well and how safe Levosimendan (ODM-109) is in treating patients with ALS. This will be done by measuring breathing function. Animal studies have shown it may be useful to improve the muscle strength of the diaphragm and thereby the breathing function for patients with ALS
